


Figure 3. St Alkmund's church, south elevation. Photo: Wendy Horton




Figure 5. North view, watercolour by Edward Williams, 1793. SA, 6001/372/3/98.




Figure 6. East end with lancets, Hugh Owen, *c*.1810. SA, xls2392.




Figure 7. West tower and entrance, 2022. Photo: Wendy Horton




Figure 8. View from south-east, 2022. Photo: Wendy Horton.




Figure 10. Rebuilt church, labelled plan by Carline and Tilley. SA, P252/J/4/1/4.




Figure 11. South wall prior to replacement of windows, c.1890. SA, PH/S/13/S/1/4.




Figure 12. North elevation, 2022. Photo: Wendy Horton.




Figure 16. Proposed plan, A. E. Lloyd Oswell, 1896. SA, P252/B/5/1/20.




Figure 17. Chancel arch, 2022. Photo: Wendy Horton.
