


Figure 1. St Julians', view from the south. Wendy Horton/VCH Shropshire, 2022




Figure 5. Sketch plan of the medieval church, c. 1750. SA, xls29674.




Figure 6a. North side of the medieval church c. 1768. SA, 6001, 299 fo. 00.




Figure 6b. South side of the medieval church, c. 1768 SA, 6001/299




Figure 8. Plan attached to the Faculty for rebuilding the church, 1748 SA, 6000/15004.




Figure 11. East End. Wendy Horton/VCH Shropshire, 2022




Figure 13. Plans by S. Pountney Smith, 1877 and 1882




Figure 17. Map of Shrewsbury, John Wood, 1838, showing the relationship of St Julians and St Almunds.
